Honor Flight "Mail Call" Guidelines

Tips for writing messages of appreciation to veterans

While veterans are on their Honor Flight plane, a **surprise** "mail call" is held and each participant receives a quantity of letters to open and review.

The messages include cards, drawings, and other items of appreciation and gratitude for the veterans' service to their country from family, friends, students and the local community. These have proven very impactful to the flight. Here are some tips for writing mail for Honor Flight"

Address the mail as "Dear Veteran" if you don't know the veteran's name.

Be meaningful...

- Keep your message positive....Brief messages are fine.
- Express gratitude for their service.
- Share hopeful messages, well wishes, and positive thoughts.
- Prayers are welcome, however please avoid excessive religious comments.
- Share about yourself, family, hobbies, work, school, pets, travel, interests, etc.
- Abstain from writing about violence, killings, illness, injury, death, and dying, etc.
- Avoid all mention of politics.

Be creative and have fun!

- Consider drawing or painting a picture instead. Please add a note to kids' drawings with their age.
- Please refrain from u sing glitter or confetti.
- Include your name and return address (optional) so veterans can write back. (Although they may not.)
- Don't seal or date the mail so veterans can easily open.

Send it early to the address indicated by your local Honor Flight chapter -- at least two weeks before the flight.
